

Report of the Education Matters Working Group of the ER-WCPT for the year 2008

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European Region of the World Confederation for Physical Therapy (WCPT) Education Matters WG

Introduction

The main objectives of the Education Matters Working Group are to promote the quality of physiotherapy education in Europe and to contribute to facilitate the reciprocity of recognition of physiotherapy qualifications.

The activity of the year 2008 can be divided in two periods, in reference to the General Meeting (GM), held in Greece, in May 2008.

At the GM we have had the opportunity to present the results of the work developed from 2006 to 2008, and it was rewarding to see that all the recommendations proposed to the GM were approved. In this report we will only summarise the main results of the GM, and highlight the mandate received for a new cycle of activity.

Activities after Junes 2008
